Computer Graphics 2 Syllabus

Overview:

In this class students will explore advanced aspects of computer graphic design, and become more exposed to other elements of artistic production using digital media. The basic progression of coursework is similar to that of Graphics 1, with students focusing on vector graphics, bitmap imaging, and animation. In addition students will learn to create more advanced levels of illustration and freehand digital production.

Each student will be encouraged to enter work into the digital art portion of Scholastics. More info on this will be made available.

<u>Grading</u>: Students will achieve points for listed objectives on each project. Creative presentation is a grading consideration at this level of graphic design. Students will be able to turn in work after the posted due date with no penalty provided that they make arrangements with the instructor, and all due effort is made to keep up with the course material.

<u>Objectives</u>: The learning objectives will vary from assignment to assignment. As we progress through the different aspects of digital media, students are expected to not only master the basics, but show improvement towards fundamental program control and elements of design in general.

<u>Work:</u> All work will be turned in as a digital copy. Exceptional work may be printed at school using the teacher's discretion; otherwise all students can save their imagery and print them at home. Certain works will be selected to be displayed at the student art show at the end of the year.

Expectations:

- Equipment Each student is expected to maintain their own computer station. Any abuse of the equipment can result in a temporary suspension from their network rights
- There is absolutely **no food** allowed in the computer lab. The first occurrence usually results in a warning. Subsequent violations will result in a detention.
- The use of the Internet is a privilege. Using external software run from flash drives or the use of proxy websites to circumvent filters is not permitted, and will result in your network rights being submitted to the IT department for review and potential suspension.
- Mobile phones and devices are to be used in class only at the teacher's discretion. Parents, please be supportive of this policy.
