Interior Perspective Drawing


By this point you have done enough practice with 1-pt perspective that you can create a fundamentally sound drawing on your own, using the basic principles and guidelines of perspective.


OPTIONS FOR ASSIGMENT

1) Find a <u>reference picture</u> to use. Make sure that the image is in 1-pt perspective, or this will get harder in a hurry. It must be an interior image that has an appropriate amount of detail (objects, structures, etc) If it is fairly basic you have the option of adding imagery to create on your own.

OR

2) Create an <u>interior from your imagination</u>. If you feel you have the creativity and skill set, you may wish to invent yourself an interior space from the ground up. You can be as crazy as you like with the decorations, hallways, etc. Just make sure that you don't over-extend yourself. Seriously, you can get really weird with this.





Everything can be created using the premise of perspective. Edges and corners can be rounded after the initial shape is created to reflect the object (beds, couches, etc.)

Start by determining the placement and height of your vanishing point. You <u>may or may not</u> have a horizon line, depending on the picture.

Follow the basic Process outlined below in order to get started on your own conversion of a photo into a drawing.
