
Intro To White Charcoal

The Premise is simple: practice applying light values in a manner that creates three dimension.



- 1) Observe the example still life. <u>Re-create the basic setup</u> on your black paper.
- 2) Use a full range of reverse value. You create <u>highlights with thicker application</u> of white charcoal. You create <u>shading by gradually decreasing the pressure</u>. The black background by itself is considered the deepest shadow possible.
- 3) Practice smooth transitions from light to dark. The goal is to have as <u>few visible pencil strokes</u> as possible.
- 4) Charcoal smears easily. If right handed, work left to right. If left handed, go right to left.
- 5) Use a kneaded eraser for major cleanups or smears
